Last month I mentioned using YouTube as a place where I get ideas for new quilt patterns along with lots of other things. Recently I've been watching videos on long arm quilting, repairing vintage sewing machines, old comedy skits as well as classic rock and roll groups. When I open YouTube I never know where I might end up. Last week, Jeremy had to watch the one on removing your back seat from a Jeep Wrangler so we could pack the back end for our trip. So instead of a quilt pattern idea, here is a new site to me that I recently discovered and have become fascinated with all the new ideas I found there.

Revelation Quilts has been a true revelation to me. Suze Spendler is the creator of wonderful scrap quilts patterns. Her website has video after video of how she goes about using left



over jelly rolls, shirt fabrics and precut squares, you name it, to make quilts that have interesting construction twists. No expensive one use rulers. Just supplies you already have at hand. Her YouTube channel has even more ideas. She has over 15,000 subscribers. How could I have missed her? You can also buy patterns from her website if it is easier to have something in hand rather than watch a video several times. I've added two screenshots to give you an idea of her designs.

When I get home I intend to use her patterns for my assault on Mount Scrapmore. She has given me so many ideas of how to go about that climb. So I encourage you to take some time, make some preparations and acclimate yourself to the altitude and work on your own Mount Scrapmore climb, too. Revelation Quilts. 
