# President's challenge

Every year, the president of our quilter's guild comes up with an idea for an all guild challenge. Recently we have had a color challenge, steampunk challenge and a heart challenge. So now it's up to me to come up with this year's challenge. Over two-thirds of my life has been spent in some kind of educational setting. From East Prairie Elementary, Shepard Junior High and Deerfield High school, through snow, sleet and rain, it was off to school each morning. (And I never had a snow day.) Then college, graduate school, teaching in classrooms, central office supervisor and ending up as a principal. Many of you have had similar experiences. So for my challenge I have chosen school colors. Pick a school. It can be one you attended, your children or grandchildren attend or just one you particularly like. Lynn will provide kits with material and pattern or bring your own. Simple designs and big blocks are the easiest. Bring a sewing machine and necessary supplies. If you prefer, there is always a need for people to press (Irons and boards provided, people to sit and sew on bindings, or just generally be a gofer. If you can only come for a couple of hours, that is fine, don't feel like you have to stay the whole time. Sandwiches will be provided for supper. Please try and come. May 16—Modern Batiks of Java & Bali—Kim Oleson Kim learned the art of traditional Hawaiian appliqué from masters in Hawaii. She developed reverse appliqué techniques over years of experimentation. The lecture and trunk show features batik-making process in Java.



May 17 -The workshop "Raw Edge Reverse Appliqué" requires the purchase of a kit for \$30 (in addition to the workshop fee of \$30) that will include supplies, equipment, pattern and materials to make a 2.5 in square block that can be used in a quilt, bag or other project. The kit fee is payable to Kim on the day of the workshop by cash or credit card. Please bring a paint shirt or apron and your favorite thimble. Students will work with fabric paints, air brushing, and hand stitching to add unique elements and interest to your block. # Comfort Quilts—March

Each year, in the world of scrappy quilts, some design rises to the top of the pack and becomes this year's sensation. This year is seems to be the Duckworth quilt. Created by Joanne Merrill Duckworth, her quilt idea has taken the internet by storm. If you Google Duckworth quilt you will be taken to picture after picture of these scrap fantastic quilts.

A variation of a log cabin block, you just pick a color and start sewing strips around a center square. The sewing stops when you have added enough strips to have a square a little larger than 6 and 1/2 inches. Use a ruler to square it up and just keep going.

Most Duckworth quilts use just one color, so before I left for the mountains I grabbed a shoe box of yellow and gold scraps. Started cutting some centers and then added the strips. Did some chain piecing and then snipped blocks apart with scissors. No exact seam allowances, no points to match. Just sit and sew. Couldn't be simpler. So pick a color and get going. I've already made over 40 squares and have hardly made a dent in my yellow shoe box. But at least it is a start!
